Sound Sentiment at Lausanne Conference.

The Christmas Message Will be Theme of Discussion -- United States Will Actively Participate -- Marine Horror in Gulf of California.

THE EAST CONFERENCE OPENS.

LAUSANNE, Nov. 21. — Peace on earth would result from the labors of the Near East conference was voiced by speakers at the brief opening session to-day. The sentiment was voiced first by the Swiss Federalist Hans, of the Swiss Federalist League, who presided over the opening plenary meeting, and it was taken up by both Lord Curzon and Ismet Pasha. The prospects of United States activity in the conference, and the role of the United States as a launching of a new European policy in Europe, and the presence of a strong delegation from Japan, gave world wide significance to the conference. Benito Mussolini, the new strong man of Italy, drew eyes as he moved to a place not far from the white-headed ex-Grecian Venizelos. Venizelos sat in the front row of the conference, and Ismet Pasha that the Greek army, with its 100,000 men, had systematically exterminated the Turkish countryside and had a million innocent Turks

homeless, hungry wanderers. The Ottoman Government wants peace with all, Ismet Pasha said, but he warned them that lasting peace must be founded upon mutual respect of national liberty and independence. Lord Curzon wanted Lausanne to make "final peace of all," and pledged England's whole-hearted support in this cause. It was announced that the establishment of complete accord between Premier Poincare, Lord Curzon and Premier Mussolini, on all matters coming up in the conference, would be celebrated tonight by an Entente dinner of sixty covers which M. Poincare and the French delegation tendered to the British and Italian representatives.

CLYNES LEADS OPPOSITION.

LONDON, Nov. 21. — John Robert Clynes was recognized as leader of the Opposition in Parliament to-day, after the members of the Commons had scrambled in a good natured but intense rivalry to get favorite seats. Premier Bonar

Law was given a great ovation by his supporters and Clynes by his. When the Black Rod summoned the members to the House of Lords the Prime Minister went first, but was joined immediately by Clynes, and they shook hands and walked out together. The significance of this was accepted as settling what had been a controversy since the election. The Commons re-elected J. H. Whitley as Speaker, and adjourned for the State opening on Thursday. While the Government hopes to find a safe seat for Lt. Col. Leslie Wilson, Parliamentary Secretary to the Treasury, Winston Churchill is not planning an early return. As soon as his health permits, he will visit Rome, expecting to be absent several months.

70 PERSONS DROWNED.

CALAXICO, California, Nov. 20. — Seventy persons lost their lives in the sinking of the steamer Lopelomampo in the Gulf of California, near the mouth of the Colorado River early yesterday, according to reports of the disaster.

ISMET IN UNCOMFORTABLE SITUATION.

PARIS, Nov. 20. — Ismet Pasha, chief Turkish delegate at the Lausanne Peace Conference, has again been instructed by the Anglo-American Assembly positively not to yield on the question of capitulations, according to available information reaching Paris, sent in view of the probability that one of the biggest battles of the conference will be fought over the point of the Turks insisting that foreigners be amenable to Turkish laws and Courts and of the other nations declaring for their Nationalism to be accorded extra-territorial rights. Ismet is declared to have been warned in no uncertain terms that he will be hanged if he yields on the capitulations.

CUNO SUCCEEDS IN FORMING A CABINET.

BERLIN, Nov. 21. — Wilhelm Cuno, Germany's fifth chancellor, and first non-socialist parliamentary holder of the post in the new Republic, has succeeded in forming a cabinet chiefly recruited among the three middle parties.
