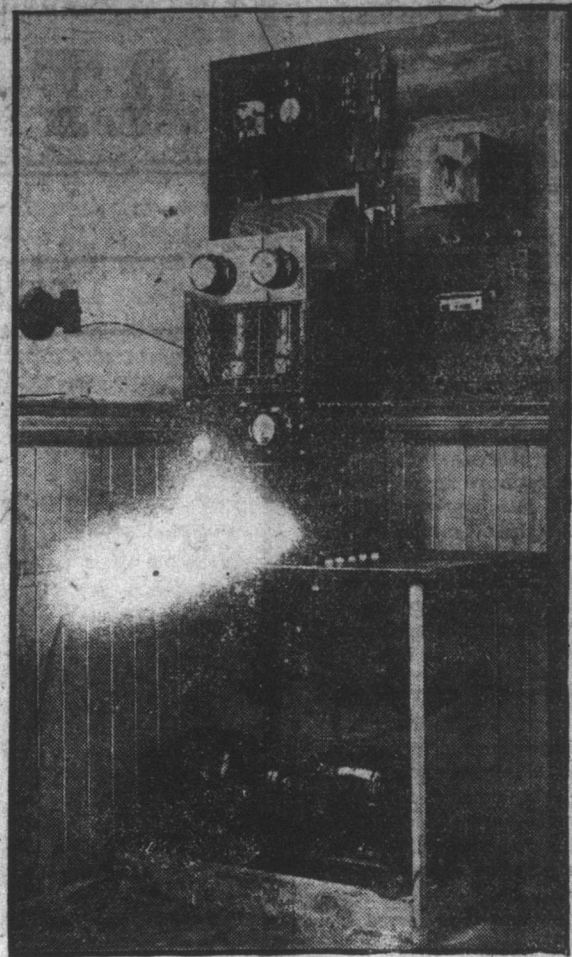

Wesley Church Broadcasting Set



STATION SWMC.

Radio transmitter, Without Speech Amplifier and High Tension Batteries.

At this time a word or two in connection with the above radio transmitter at Station SWMC may not be amiss. During the past few months this broadcasting station has been on the air on many occasions, and the excellent addresses and the music rendered, particularly at the evening services on Sundays, has been taken advantage of with great pleasure by radio listeners. In the first place the machine was introduced by the pastor of Wesley Church for the purpose of ministering to the sick and aged amongst his parishioners. It is gratifying to be able to say that this has proved in every way a complete success and much benefit has been derived therefrom. The range of the broadcast has not been defined, but we are given to understand that at the Missionary Service held on Sunday night last, at which His Excellency the Governor was present, that the broadcast had been distinctly heard in New York. Numerous messages of appreciation were also received from listeners-in at Bay Roberts, Grand Falls and other places.

Wesley broadcasting station is situated in a sound and waterproof room in the basement of the church, and is controlled and operated by Mr. Walter I. Vey, a member of the church. A brief description of the set and its working is as follows:—The set is the standard 100 watt transmitter, manufactured by the Canadian Marconi Company at their factory in Montreal. The set uses the well known Hartley currents. There are two 50-watt vacuum tubes used, one as a modulator and one as an oscillator. The filaments of these tubes are heated from the electric light mains, using a step-down transformer which produces a voltage from 110 to 10 volts. The plates of these tubes take 1,000 volts of direct current. This is furnished by a motor which is worked off the electric light main and is directly coupled to a special high tension generator. When the set is operating at full capacity the aerial radiation is 45 amperes. During the operating of the machine the operator sets the speech amplifier by means of five controlling dials, which thus controls the im-

pulses from the microphone before it reaches the transmitter to pass on to the air. The amplifier has attached to it one six-volt and one eight-volt battery, besides 250 volts for the plates and tubes, and 110 volts for the grids.

The microphone used at this station is a very costly one. It is of the Marconi magnetic type and is exactly the same type as used in the larger Canadian stations, such as the 7KW station, operated by La Presse Newspaper, Montreal, Que. This set was designed and built by Mr. R. Letts, of the engineer department of the Canadian Marconi Co. For a number of years Mr. Letts was assistant superintendent of the Newfoundland division. He is well known in St. John's and is a brother-in-law of Mr. J. J. Collins, Superintendent of Marconi Wireless Co., who installed the outfit in Wesley Church in June last. To Mr. Walter I. Vey, the radio operator at Wesley Church, much of its success is due. The very best of results have been obtained by the radio listeners-in, and it is to the wide knowledge possessed by Mr. Vey and his painstaking efforts that this success is due in a great measure. Maritime Bull for Newfoundland

ENTERPRISING NEWFOUNDLAND FARMER HIGHLY PRAISED.

One of the finest herds in British North America is owned by A. V. Ross, Grove Farm, St. John's, Nfld. It is also one of the best housed and attended, and includes upwards of thirty head. The attendants dress in white duck and the stable walls appear from the photograph to be composed largely of windows. The milk is marketed to St. John's and brings from 15 to 20 cents a quart.

Mr. Ross is a frequent visitor to Maritime farms where his foundation stock was purchased. He has also visited Ontario, but found he could not improve his herd further by importations from there. In the Maritime he has latterly confined his purchases to the Holstein pure breeds in the vicinity of Truro and Charlottetown. More than thirty pure bred Holsteins have been exported from Charlottetown to Mr. Ross in the past five years by steamer, which sells direct.

Last year when Bunbury Farm bought a new sire, Mr. Ross purchased Pat, the former sire, who now is the 2800 lb. head of his great herd. Lately he has also purchased the young son of Pat, out of the Maritime

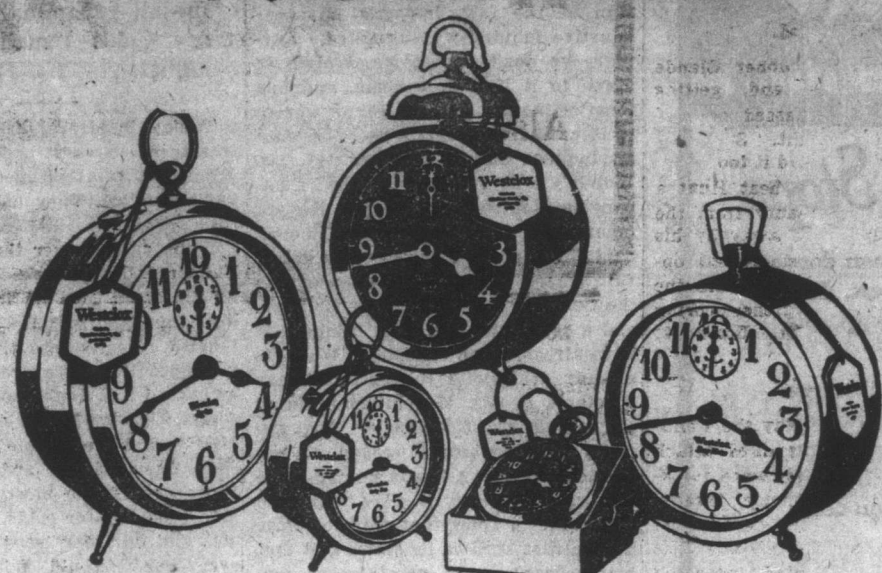
Champion four-year-old, Countess Abbecker Hienke, who has a record of 102 3/4 lbs. butter in a year. This cow, we are told, is running at present a great five year old record and has well over 700 lbs. butter for her first six months and over 16,000 lbs. milk. The young bull, whose name is Count Francis Hienke, traces to Francis Maid 2nd, the four times Canadian Champion show cow, through her sire, and also traces to Pauline Colantha Pesch through her dam. The latter cow was twice Canadian show champion. The youngster has every appearance of developing his two grand-dam's great show qualities—Maritime Farmer.
