We do not doubt that the once haughty and powerful slave aristocracy is now passing away. Emancipation girdled that tree. The woodman does not wait to see the leaves wither on the oak around which he has cut the fatal notch. He knows that the work is done.

Wide as are the distances, it is as natural for us to desire an outlet swards both east and west, as it is for our neighbors; it is as natural as for a man to prefer a corner lot for his own dwelling, or a corner store for his business.—The oceans are definite and indisputable boundary lines, which no Ashburton treaty can quibble away.
