The plague of mice which has been causing such widespread disaster in Scotland of late continues and increases, and a special commission of the Department of Agricultural is now at work taking evidence in the matter with a view to devising some effective remedy. Some interesting points have been brought out during the progress of the commission. Quite a number of farmers attributed the plague of mice to the killing of the birds of prey and weasels by the gentlemen owners shooting over the estates, and by the keepers who killed the weasels because the weasels destroyed the game. One man said the keepers had killed 100 weasels on his farm and the adjoining estate. The mice had increased and destroyed the pastures, and he had lost \$5,000 on sheep in consequence. His family had lived on the farm for three centuries. Another man said that for the same reason his crop of lambs this year numbered but 323 against an average of 600 or 700. The situation is very serious, and nothing the farmers have been able to do so far has lessened the scourge.


