Londoner Tells of Desperate Fight at Langemarck and the Result.

CROUCH IN SHELL HOLES

Calmly Await the Word to Advance Under Hail of Screaming Shrapnel.

How the Canadians won the battle of Langemarck, after worming their way close to the German line, seeking cover n the holes made by the big shells, and then taking the enemy on the run in a final gallant charge, is told below in a letter written by Hugh Mac-Crimmon, of 350 Oxford street. The writer was wounded by shrapnel while he was charging the German line. The bursting shell threw him fifteen feet. He wrote from a hospital at Paignton, England, on May 4. "Paignton, England, May 4th, 1915.

"We were called up about 1 a.m.

Friday morning and beat it for the line a little north of Ypres. We got there about 3 a.m., crossed the canal and then got orders to dig our-selves in. "I could tell you lots of wonderful things but will do that little by little. I will get some leave, after I am convalescent, so I don't expect to see "HUGH."


