

PREMIER KING MAY SOW SEED OF RECIPROCITY

Conference in Washington
With Hughes Fraught
With Possibilities.

HAS BARGAINING POWER

Dominion Can Confer Many
Favors in Several Issues
Pending.

OTTAWA, July 6.—The announcement today that Premier W. L. Mackenzie King will confer with United States Secretary of State Charles E. Hughes in Washington next Wednesday indicates that the prime minister of Canada intends to turn his great energies in his spare time to questions of external affairs which must be faced in the near future.

There are today outstanding between Canada and the United States a considerable list of controversial problems which cannot be disposed of by the international joint commission, but must be the subject of governmental negotiations.

Firstly, there is the subject of the Chicago drainage canal and its effect upon the level of navigation on the Great Lakes.

Secondly, there is a controversy about the regulation of the level of the Lake of the Woods and its outlets and tributaries, and, thirdly, there is the problem of the dam at the Long Sault, which the American Aluminum Company were allowed to erect in 1918 by special permission in order to facilitate the manufacture of munitions.

Permit for Five Years.

There was a distinct understanding that the permit was only for five years, and that at the end of that period the case must be reconsidered under a fresh application. It is known that the American Aluminum Company, who are bound, if called upon, to remove the dam, are anxious to retain it, for it has proved a valuable asset.

In addition, there are some other minor issues which, if not important, are troublesome. In practically all of them Canada is asked to confer some indulgence, and therefore a useful element of bargaining power is available.

If Premier King, as minister of external affairs, sets on foot while in the United States capital negotiations for the adjustment of these problems, and if he can induce his Quebec followers to take a more friendly view of the St. Lawrence waterway project, he might find himself involved in friendly contacts with the Harding administration, which may ultimately produce an atmosphere more favorable to a reciprocity treaty.

The chances are that reciprocity might not come as in 1911 in the form of a purely commercial agreement, but there might emerge a most valuable comprehensive agreement covering the commercial, physical and transportation relations of the two countries.

**VETS ABANDON
HIKE TO CAPITAL**

TORONTO, July 6.—The proposed hike this week-end to Ottawa of the associated veterans has been abandoned and it is not likely that any attempt will be made to march again to the capital until September. It is expected that a large contingent of men will arrive from Brantford, at least one hundred having promised to do so, but at a meeting tonight in Queen's Park "General" Riley announced that so far only six hikers had turned up.

AGED CITIZENS EXCHANGE BLOWS AT ST. THOMAS

Magistrate Maxwell Detains John
Cole For Mental Examination.

ST. THOMAS, July 6.—Both over 80 years of age, and still capable of settling their differences with their fists, two old men of the Thomas Williams Home here, appeared before Magistrate Maxwell Thursday morning, following a dispute during which several blows were exchanged.

Adam Coyle, 91 years of age, was the complainant, and John Cole, four years his junior, was charged with assault. Cole claimed ownership of a cane in Coyle's possession, and when it was refused him, he threw the complainant on the floor and sat on him. The superintendent of the institution separated the pair, but another quarrel followed, and Coyle vigorously defended himself with the cane in question, with the result that Cole exhibited several scars. Coyle appeared undaunted, however, and stoutly maintained ownership of the stick.

After hearing the circumstances, the magistrate came to the conclusion that Cole's mental condition should be examined, and remanded him a week for this purpose.

ATTEMPTS TO DIE FOR LOVE OF MIKE

CHICAGO, July 6.—"For the love of Mike," Bertha Sloboska jumped into the Chicago River Tuesday night.

She did it to prove to Michael Bondovics that she loved him. Mike plunged into the river after her and dragged her safely to the bank. Nine-Year-Old Boy Slips From Floating Log and Drowns in St. Clair River

SARNIA, July 6.—While playing on one of the hundreds of logs from a broken timber raft that are strewn along the shore at Lake Huron Beach shortly before 3 o'clock this afternoon, Herbert Best, aged 9, son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Best of Hamilton, drifted off from shore and fell into the water. His half-cousin and companion, Thomas Laurie, aged 12, of Sarnia, who was playing on shore, went to the aid of his chum, and was drawn under by the younger boy's struggles.

They were in the water for several minutes before aid came, when two men, R. McKenzie and G. Toombs, brought the boys ashore. Despite measures of resuscitation employed by the two men, the Best boy failed to recover, and died before a doctor or the pulmotor could arrive. His older playmate, though suffering from the effects of the immersion after his attempt to rescue his playmate, was brought around without much difficulty.

The little Hamilton boy was spending a few days with his mother's aunt, Mrs. Thomas Laurie, 184 South Beach street, and had gone to the beach with his half-cousin for the afternoon. His father, Herbert Best, sen., is a moulder, and resided in Sarnia before moving to Hamilton some five years ago.
