Canadian Press Despatch. from every province of the dominion were present at the annual meeting to day of the Canadian social hygiene council, presided over by Mr. Justice Riddell president Although an operating deficit on the past year of \$195 was reported, the annual report showed that the organization has a surplus of \$7,211. The ministers or deputy ministers of health for British Columbia, Alberta Saskatchewan and Ontario were among those present.

Hon. Mr. Justice Riddell, in his ad-

dress, remarked that it was difficult to maintain dominion interest in a single disease problem which involves the expenditure of money, small in comparison with the expenditure on oth debts. He regretted that the dominic grant to the council had been reduced \$50,000 during the past year.
