PORT STANLEY, Ont., August 30 .-(Special to The Free Press).-That the (Special to The Free Press).—That the damage from the corn borer in Elgin County will not be as serious as last year, and that with continued co-operation between the federal and provincial authorities, as well as the farmers, the insect can in a few years' time be completely stamped out, was the opinion expressed to-day by Arthur Gibson, Ottawa, Dominion entomologist, and R. E. Treherne, Ottawa, the field specialist of the department, following stamped out, and the winner of the Joe Beckett-Frank specialist of the department, following specialist of the department of the same special specia

Messrs. Gibson and Treherne went carefully over the work which had been done to stop the ravages of the insect, and made an inspection of many of the corn fields in the district. They expressed satisfaction with the progress which had been made in fighting the borer and highly complimented Mr. Crawford on his work. They were of the opinion that through the efforts of the department, along with the provincial authorities, who under J. C. Spencer have been co-operating in the fight, Western Ontario has been saved thousands of dollars. If no steps had been taken to fight the borer it would have spread all over Western Ontario, and corn as well as other crops this season might have been completely season might have been completely

be the greatest vigilance on the part of the agricultural departments of the two governments, as well as the farmers. A tribute was paid by Mr. Gibson to the willingness of the farmers to co-operate with the department. Last fall they were strongly advised to plant their corn late. In most cases this was done, and this is regarded as one of the chief factors in the prevenone of the chief factors in the prevention of the spread of the insect The officials advocate in harvesting corn close cropping and the burning of stubble afterwards in order to kill the larva. They will also urge again late planting of corn next spring.
