Canada stands seventh place among the nations of the world as a shipbuilder, with 170,625 gross tons under construction.

A new jury act for the Province of Alberta, tabled in the Legislature, provides that women may serve as jurors as well as men, but it is stipulated that no women shall be compelled to so serve, unless prior to summons, she signs a document as to her willingness to act in that cap-

The Wabash Railway proposes to educe the wages of its 3500 unskilled laborers. The Northern Pacific and Great Northern contemplate reduction from 48 to 25c an hour and the Maine Central management says that a reduction of wages would be proposed soon to 4,300 employees, including clerks, mechanics, machinists, maintenance of way men, station men and heads of departments.

STANDARDIZING PARTS OF AGRICULTURAL MACHINERY

A resolution standing in the name of A. B. McCoig, M.P., for Kent, providing for the standardization of all parts of agricultural machinery from the first day of November, 1922, was given consideration in the House of Commons last week. In speaking of the resolution Mr. McCoig said he knew that his proposal met with the approval of those who used agricultural implements, but also, he understood, of manufacturers. His idea was to standardize all parts so that they would be interchangeable. Under present conditions if a man was so unfortunate as to break a part on a certain make of machine he was forced to obtain a part which was exactly similar. If it happened that there was no agent who sold parts for his machine near at hand he found it necessary to send some distance to get the part. Necessarily this caused delay and inconvenience to a large number of farmers. Mr. McCoig said it would not necessitate changing the types of machinery if the parts were standardized and that this standardization could be accomplished with little expense to the manufacturers of agricultural implements.

Hon. T. A. Crerar emphasized the importance of dealing with the question without delay.
