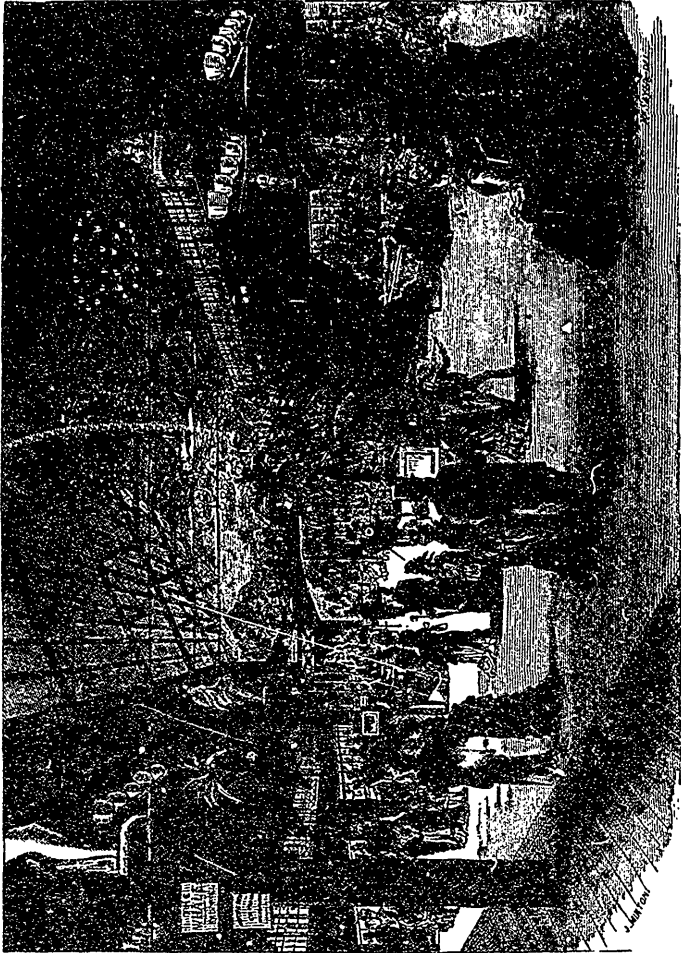


FIG. 1.—INTERIOR VIEW OF THE AQUARIUM.
