

ROASTRD EGGS .- Pick a hole in each egg shell with a pin. Wrap the egg in wet paper, and put it into hot ashes to cook. Fifteen minutes should cook them. Serve as boiled cees.

ROSTED EGGS.—Pick a hole in each egg shell with a pin. Wrap the egg in wet paper and put it into hot ashes to cook. Fifteen minutes should cook them. Serve as boiled eggs.

DELICATE CAKE.—Take one cupful of butter, two of white sugar, four of flour, one of sweet cream, the whites of eight eggs and one-halt teaspoinful of baking powder; flavour with lemon or rose-water.

Bake in "Turk's heads" like sweet cake, but serve hot for breakfast, putting it on the table whole.

BAVARIAN Cheam.—One half box of gelatine disolved in a little cold water, the whites of five eggs beaten stiff and mixed with it, flavour with vanilla, one quart of new milk brought to a boil, yolks of five eggs heaten stiff and mixed with one cup of sugar; pour these alternately into the boil ing milk. Stir well while cooking about ten minutes, then pour into moulds.

MOULD OF CHICKEN. - Broil a chicken or chickens it as little wate- as possible, until very tender; pick the meat from the bones, rejecting the skin, and chop or cut into smarpices—not mince. Season with pepper an saltr Boil until hard half a dozen eggs, and cut into slices. Put into the bottom of a mould some slices of egg, cover with chicken, then arrange some slices of egg around the sides of the mould, press the chicken against the pieces to keep in place. In this way fill the dish. Boil down the broth so that there will be about a cupful for each chicken: sea son, and to each cupful add a teaspoonful of gelatine, which you have first soaked in a very little cold water. 




