

NOTES ON THE BIRDS OF KING'S CO., NOVA SCOTIA—PART II.

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Dendragapus canadensis (*Linn.*) CANADA GROUSE.

Rather rare.

Bonasa umbellus togata (*Linn.*) CANADIAN RUFFED GROUSE.

Fairly abundant. They are now protected by law till October, 1901.

Circus hudsonius (*Linn.*) MARSH-HAWK.

Common from April till December.

Accipiter velox (*Wils.*) SHARP-SHINNED HAWK.

Fairly common throughout the year.

Accipiter cooperi (*Bonap.*) COOPER'S HAWK.

Not common. Absent in winter.

Accipiter atricapillus (*Wils.*) GOSHAWK.

Not very common. Present throughout the year.

Buteo borealis (*Gmel.*) RED-TAILED HAWK.

Fairly common except in winter.

Buteo lineatus (*Gmel.*) RED-SHOULDERED HAWK.

Not so common as the preceding species.

Archibuteo lagopus sancti-johannis (*Gmel.*) AMERICAN ROUGH- LEGGED HAWK.

Quite common on the Grand Pré in early winter and spring.

Haliaeetus leucocephalus (*Linn.*) BALD EAGLE.

Rare. A few years ago a pair nested on Long Island.

Falco rusticolus obsoletus (*Gmel.*) BLACK GYRFALCON.

One specimen was taken at Long Island, Jan. 8th, 1898.

Falco peregrinus anatum (*Bonap.*) DUCK HAWK.

Not common. Sometimes seen at Long Island in August and September.

Falco columbarius (*Linn.*) PIGEON HAWK.

Not common. Present from March till January.

Falco sparverius (*Linn.*) SPARROW HAWK.

Fairly common from April till October.
