Pursuant to a winding up order of the Court dated 6th September, 1902, made in this matter, there will be sold by and with the approbation of William Louis Scott, Esquire, the Master of this Court at Ottawa, at his Chambers, in the Court House, at the City of Ottawa, at the hour of two o'clock p. m. on the 17th DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1902, the following real and personal estate, the property of the said Company, all situate in the Province of British Columbia, Canada:

PARCEL NO. 1 - Lot No. 55, comprising 22,600 acres more or less in the Seyward District, Vancouver Island. Title renewable leasehold.

PARCEL NO. 2 - Lot No. 439, G. 2, comprising 9,280 acres more or less, situate in the District of New Westminster.

Lot No. 50, comprising 6,700 acres more or less, in the Chilliwack District.

Lot No. 55, comprising 15,900 acres more or less in the Chilliwack District.

The whole structure from foundation up is built in a most substantial manner, well timbered and braced with knees, metal roof, contains three steam engines of three hundred horse power each, and is fitted throughout with special machinery for working up B.C. timber of all dimensions as well as for working out the refuse into laths, pickets, etc., also planers and matchers, with a large assortment of tools, plant and equipment; also one large refuse burner, one large stone boiler house, metal roof, containing ten large tubular boilers, steam pumps with all necessary and proper attachments, good frame office, boarding house, cottages, horse stables, blacksmith shop and machine shop, with good efficient and complete plant of tools and machinery in each shop.

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The demand for lumber has not been just as good as was figured on for early October. Fewer orders have been booked from the Eastern States, where business has been retarded by the coal strike. Locally trade is moderately active, the large volume of building in Toronto compelling retail dealers to keep constantly replenishing their stocks. Some uncertainty prevails as to the future demand for building lumber, as it is reported that the high price of lumber, brick, and materials generally has prevented the carrying out of certain proposed building operations. Nevertheless, we do not anticipate lower prices for lumber. There are light stocks at the mills and manufacturing is nearly at an end for this season. Some of the mills are shutting down earlier than usual in order to secure men for logging operations, while other mills have closed on account of a shortage of logs, due to the tie-up on the Spanish River. With favorable conditions for operations the production of saw logs and square timber this winter would probably be above the average, but the scarcity of labor is likely to considerably restrict the output. Red pine is strengthening and promises to command higher prices for the coming winter's production than were realized this season.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The reports that sales have been made of spruce deals for next spring delivery at prices higher than ruled during the current year has created a feeling of hopefulness among manufacturers, who look for prices to at least continue firm. The United States is buying all the clapboards that can be found; in fact, the supply is practically cornered,
