432 Responsibility of Consular Services abroad and High Commissions in the issuance of Canadian passports

Canadian Passports are issued under the authority of the Secretary of State for External Affairs in his exercise of the prerogative of the Crown respecting the issuance and control of passports. Canadian missions abroad have been charged by the Secretary of State for External Affairs to provide passport services to Canadians outside Canada. Missions are to adhere to the procedures regulating the issuance of passports contained in the Canadian Passport Order PC 1981-1472 4 June, 1981. Functional direction, materiel and operational information regarding issuance of Canadian passports are provided by the Passport Office to missions abroad.

Figure 7 provides the net cash flow that the Passport Office needs to finance the issuance of Canadian passports abroad. Revenues collected by consular services abroad are recorded under the Passport Office Revolving Fund activity and a refund is made to the Department for services provided by consular services abroad.
