will become executive director of the APEC secretariat when Canada becomes APEC chair in January 1997.

History

Dynamic trade and investment flows in East Asia in the 1980s led to a growing consensus that better regional consultation mechanisms were needed to replace the institutional vacuum which had existed in the Pacific since the Second World War.

In 1989, then Australian Prime Minister Hawke initiated discussions on regional economic co-operation among the 12 leading Asia-Pacific economies, building on the private-sector Pacific Basin Economic Council and the tripartite (academics, business and government) Pacific Economic Co-operation Conference.

An expanded membership, eight annual meetings of ministers of foreign affairs and trade, a special 1990 Uruguay Round meeting in Canada, two APEC leaders summits, and a host of meetings of APEC ministers responsible for finance, the environment, telecommunications, transportation and small and medium-sized enterprises have helped APEC evolve into a dynamic, responsive organization.
