

legislation under paragraphs (b), (c) and (d):

- (a) Orders of the Day for the third reading of bills;
- (b) an Order of the Day which was under consideration at the time of adjournment;
- (c) Orders of the Day which had not been reached at the time of adjournment;
- (d) remaining Orders of the Day.

Preambles

**22.** A motion or inquiry prefaced by a written preamble shall not be received by the Senate.

Withdrawal of motion on inquiry

**23.** A senator who has made a motion or presented an inquiry may withdraw or modify the same by leave of the Senate.

Motion not seconded

**24.** A motion made in the Senate, but not seconded, shall not be debated or put from the Chair.

Manner of speaking

**25.** A senator desiring to speak in the Senate shall rise in his place and address himself to the rest of the senators.

Two or more senators rising to speak

**26.** When two or more senators rise to speak, the Speaker shall call upon the senator who in his opinion first rose in his place; but a motion may be made that any senator who has risen "be now heard" or "do now speak".

Right to speak

**27.** A senator may speak to any question before the Senate, a question of privilege, or upon a point of order, or upon a motion or an inquiry, or in making a mere interrogation, but not otherwise except with the consent of a majority of the Senate which shall be given or withheld without debate.

Speaking only once

**28.** A senator shall not speak more than once to any question or other matter before the Senate except in explanation of a material part of his speech in which he may have been misunderstood, and then he shall not introduce new matter.
