I have taken the liberty to send you by mail some old nearly worn-out MSS., which I would ask you to place in the hands of some body interested in the prehistory of the European ancestors. The package contains "Chapters of Archaic History" and some notes on the linguistic sources of such history. I have it copied and will try to present it to the Smithsonian Institution or some society. ~~The~~ Sm. Inst. is mostly interested in Indian archaeology and in physical anthropology. That does not look very promising.

The "Chapters &c." sent here covers the time between the national formations in western Asia and the Sumerian settlements in Sinar. Look and see how far out of line I get.

The University or any private person need not be accountable to me for the fate of the MS. You are allowed to print all of it or part of with comments or otherwise, with additions or contradictions. The truth is all we seek. It has been read in England a couple of months.
