Supplies have been received from Chinese Red Cross and American Cross and the London Lord have been or ha Chinese Red Cross and American Red Cross and the London Lord Mayor's Fund. These have been organised and distributed to hospitals where they are available for present needs and can be used for emergencies which may arise. Supplies which have not been distributed are held in reserve for future use.

The Hospital Committee, with Dr. F. Oldt as Chairman, arranged for the co-operation of several Mission Hospitals in South China, in case of an invasion. Supplies were distributed in advance to some 10 different centres. Just prior to the invasion of Canton, a Service Corps of the International Red Cross led by Dr. Wong Man and a party of 140 workers recruited mostly from the the Internaction.
