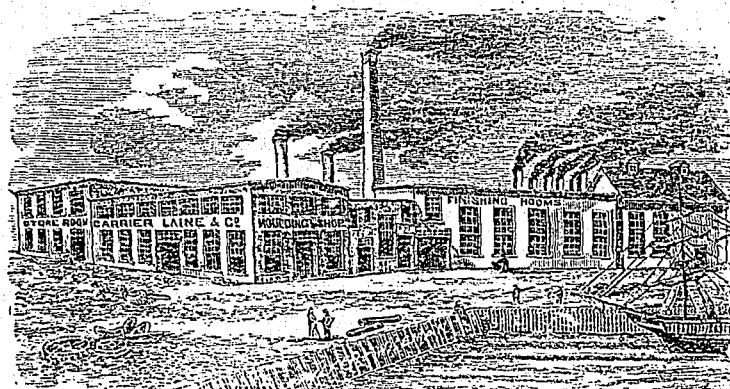
The trains to Halifax and St. John run through to
