But the French Islands, upon which their Fisheries depend, are undoubtedly of the utmost Importance, as the Loss of them tends greatly to weaken the Enemy's Marine, and to strengthen our own, With regard to Senegal and Gorée, if I am rightly informed, Mr. Phad no other Share in the Conquest of them, than in giving his Approbation of the Measure which had been proposed as an Object worthy our Attention. Who first projected the Conquest of Martinico and Guadalupe, I know not; but this one
