FRATERNALISM THE KEYNOTE FOR THE AGE THAT IS TO COME

Dr. Lyman Abbott Predicts Changes From the Individualism of the Present.

New York, Dec. 25.—Advocating a fraternalism that he differentiated from Socialism, Dr. Lyman Abbott spoke to a People's Institute audience in Cooper Union on "The Coming Age."

"To me," he said, "it seems that it will be an age of fraternalism. It is a future full of great possibilities that we are facing, and I think we are treading it, perhaps slowly, to the goals of unity and fraternity. We have lived in an autocratic age, out of which we may have grown, and we are living in an age of individualism, out of from which we are passing. To come is the fraternalistic era."

"God rained down untold wealth on us here in America. We have followed the secret-larger-who-can get the most out of it. We have held that commerce is war, and all is fair in war, and we are getting away from that. Right here are population, I think, that indicate a new era."

"I believe, if we will do this, that we will have a more fraternalistic era. Statistics of Charles B. Spahr show that more than 15 per cent of Englishmen have more than \$500,000 each, while the majority of the Americans have that amount."

Death from Exposure. Inquest to be Held in Connection with Stephen Duggan's Demise. An inquest will likely be held on the body of Stephen Duggan, who expired while being taken to the Western Hospital in the patrol wagon early yesterday morning. Duggan was found by a constable in a shed in the rear of 700 Dundas-street at 11:30 on Monday night and taken to the hospital, but he died on the way. The coroner's jury was composed of Dr. G. G. Rowe of Queen-street, who ordered Duggan to be taken to the hospital, and Dr. J. G. Rowe, who was called to the station about 12 o'clock and Duggan was dying from exposure when he found him, and that he had evidently been drinking.
