SOME BULLISH INFLUENCES

Caused Wheat Yesterday to Overcome Bearish Tendency

And Gain Fractionally in Price in Chicago

—Better's Big Sales—Increased Demand From France and Perennial and Small Shipments From Argentine Ports—Local Cattle and Produce Markets.

Small Argentine shipments for the week, reported increased demand from France and Portugal, and the existence of a considerable stock interest in Chicago combined to offset the bearish condition of wheat on that market today, and as a result, prices advanced. July wheat gained 1/2c for the day, May 1/4c and the September and December wheat 1/4c.

Portugal will reduce her wheat duty from 8% to 5% per bushel, in order to allow two and one-quarter million bushels to be imported last year.
