OPPOSE SEPARATE SCHOOLS

Niagara Synod Follow Example of Toronto Brethren in This Respect.

WOULD SHUT OUT THE 'BOOKIES'

Hamilton, June 18—Like the Toronto Synod, the Niagara Synod voted today a resolution favoring voluntary or separate schools this afternoon by a large majority. Rev. Father Whitcombe was the mover of the resolution. He said the Hamilton Board of Education was good it spent money, but intimated that it was not good for much else. The Synod also unanimously endorsed the resolution condemning gambling on horse races and stock markets that was passed by the Toronto Synod. Dr. Miller, principal of Bishop Ridley College, said that it was high time that laws were passed to prevent "bookies" from doing business. Rev. C. E. White introduced a motion to form a Young People's Society. He said the Church of England was losing the young people all over the country, even after they were confirmed, because many of the church people thought they were better than others, and acted in that way. The matter was referred to the Standing Committee.

TORONTO HOME COVERS FESTIVAL

JULY 1ST TO 4TH 1903

Plans are now fully matured and complete by the Board of Trade Home Covers Festival from July 1 to 4. Considerable changes have been made since the program was first given out, and in the eyes of the committee a great deal for the better. On July 1, the 36th anniversary of the Confederation, contingents will arrive several thousands strong from Chicago, Detroit, Buffalo, Rochester, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Milwaukee, New York, Boston, Philadelphia, and other large centres of the United States, among them contingents from as far off as Los Angeles, California, and Atlanta, Georgia.

The arriving visitors will be met at the station by the Reception committee and bands. In the afternoon there will be the Dominion Day Regatta, increase and baseball matches, and a reception at which several prominent people will be present. The Veterans of '61 will also hold an open air smoking concert. The second day, Thursday, July 2, will be a huge fête from morning till night. The other days will be in uniform. After the parade there will be a reception on the university lawn.
