ON EVE OF **LLECTIONS**

A special despatch from Pembroke says: The news in The Sunday World that Gamey was coming into North Renfrew was hailed with every expression of gratification by the local Conservatives and by the men who are managing Mr. Dunlop's election campaign. It is believed that he is just the sort of man to arouse the lukewarm Liberals to a sense of the ramifications of the Liberal machine. He may not appeal to men like W. K. White, K.C., a Conservative of the old school, but among the mass of the electors who think crudely he will be a power. The electors are curious to know what manner of man he is, for his notoriety has come this far, and his advent is awaited with unconcealed impatience.

The campaign grows hot. The triumph expected for Premier Ross did not materialize. He had no chance to laud his administration, but was by a peculiar circumstance, forced to defend himself from his own friend. No votes were won by the Premier. He was so sick of his reception that he got out of town as soon as he could on Saturday morning. North Repfrew will see him no more.

The present week will see the riding bespotted with the orators of both sides, and the welkin will ring with volleys of words. But the fate of the election rests with the organizations that do not so loudly advertise their presence. In numbers of organizers from foreign ridings, the Liberals beat the Conservatives ten to one. The latter are depending on their local workers, not so the farmer.

Much will depend on how the lumbermen, the Germans and the French Canadians will vote. It is generally accepted that each of these classes will go one way or the other largely in a mass. It will be a game of "follow the leader," and the critical episode will be the capture of the leadership. Can the Liberals control the lumbermen? Thos, Mackle, M.P., and Lorne Hale are lumbermen, but so also is E. A. Dunlop to some extent, along with his friends, the Whites.
