

Baraboo, Wis., April 7.—"Rattlesnakes is my hobby. What is yours?"

This is what you read on a card which a tail, bashful man of 32 may hand you as you step from the train in the little village of Merrimack, on Lake Wisconsin.

He is Elmer Keitel, known as the "Rattlesnake Catcher of Devil's Lake." He has done more than any other person to preserve bird life in the state park and allay the fears of thousands of tourists wha visit there every year.
