Premier Suggests That Members Attend More Regularly—The Debate on the Address.

In opening the debate on the speech from the throne, W. H. Hearst, and J. W. Johnson occupied the chief positions in the legislative procedure yesterday. Both delivered excellent speeches, the Mr. Johnson was rather more discursive than usual.

Sir James Whitney spoke at some length on the procedure on the matter, and foreshadowed the close of the session by Good Friday. The procedure was as perfect as experience could suggest, but there had fallen into a loose, happy-go-lucky way of doing business. A great number of the members lived a long distance from Toronto, when they spent three days a week here as they had been doing.
