SAYS BOOK OF GENESIS READS LIKE HISTORY

Rev. R. Hobbs Submits Higher Criticism to Court of Common Sense.

Rev. R. Hobbs, pastor of Gerrard Street Methodist Church, preached last evening on "The First Eleven Chapters of Genesis, in the Light of the New Testament. In outlining the leading events in those chapters, he said they "read like history" to all ordinary Bible students.

The preacher then called on several officials to read 25 or 30 passages from the New Testament from the sayings of Jesus and the parables and events referred to in the first eleven chapters of Genesis.

Surely, he said, this was not a matter of a tempt in a teapot. It was more like a storm at sea, or of carrying war into Africa. This was as it should be, for the importance of the question demanded that all serious-thinking Christian men should become profoundly concerned and alarmed when men were tampering with and destroying faith in foundation truths. Indeed he was led to exclaim: "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him." In their modern methods of scriptural interpretation there was little, or nothing, about "The Word of the Lord" coming into me, saying—or "Thus saith the Lord," or of the One whose word is called the word of God speaking to the people down thru the ages. "They leave little or no room for the supernatural or the holy man of God who spoke as he was moved by the Holy Spirit! Inspiration in its highest and best sense with him is gone, or reduced to a mere human elation; the prophet—the seer—the double-sighted—was reduced to men like themselves. And even the divine and unselfish Lord, "who spoke as never man spoke," is degraded to the same level, for they say that he quoted scripture like the others teachers of his day.

But the preacher then said that "He taught as one having authority and not as the scribes." It seemed to him that the lowest court of appeal to which scriptural interpretation could be submitted was that of common sense, a sense which many, and to say do not possess. Hence the serious problem arising in all such cases was "what will they do for a guide in the absence of common sense?"
