Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards—yesterday consisted of 115 cars; 1001 cattle, 747 calves, 4479 hogs, 27 sheep and lambs.

Of the 1001 cattle on sale yesterday the majority were common inferior animals. Trade was exceptionally slow; if anything, it was worse than Tuesday. Prices, however, held fairly steady at Tuesday's level. Two steers, 1330 lbs. each, sold at \$12 per cwt., which was the highest price for such animals.

Cows were steady at \$10.00 for choice, only a few selling at the latter price, and choice bulls sold at \$10.00. Stockers and feeders were steady, while milkers and springers were in good demand. In fact, dealers were unable to fill all their orders in this line. Choice cows sold at \$9.00 to \$10.00, with a few at \$11.00 and \$12.00.
