It is of all-wool cheviot-finished tweed, in fawn and brown heather mixtures, and is full lined with twill or mercerized cotton. Sizes 34 to 42. Special, Friday, \$18.75.

AT THE same price are all wool and union wool and cotton cheviot, tweed and chinchilla-finished fabrics, in plain blue, medium and dark grey, fawn and brown shades, and in checks, stripes or mixed effects. In the half-belted Ulsterette style, the half-belted storm Ulster, the all-around belted, medium-length coat and easy-fitting slip-on. All have large convertible collars.
