YELLOWSTONE PARK.

CONGRESS passed a bill setting aside, as a national park or reservation, a tract of land of about three thousand square miles, making it a pleasure-ground forever. It is situated between the 44th and 45th parallels of latitude, and reaches from the 110th meridian to a short distance beyond the 111th.
