EVER HEAR OF
DANISH PASTRY?

St. John Soon to Be Treated to This Popular and Tasty Palate Regulator.

L. C. Klitteng, a native of the Isle of Lessee, Denmark, and the man who has introduced the delectable pastry of that land to Canada and the United States, is in town and is at the Royal.

In Moncton, N. B., on route here, he gave a demonstration of his skill as a pastry baker in a local bakery, the first 100 pieces baked being presented to President-elect and Mrs. W. G. Harding.

In 1918, two days after Klitteng's arrival in the United States he furnished sweets for the White House wedding. He is at present on a tour of the world to spread Danish pastry "propaganda" in every civilized country.

In New York the new culinary creations have taken hold to the extent of almost 1,000,000 pieces a day, and visits to Hawaii, Japan and China are expected to produce equally favorable results.

Mr. Klitteng has toured the United States and also demonstrated his culinary art in Toronto, Montreal and Quebec.

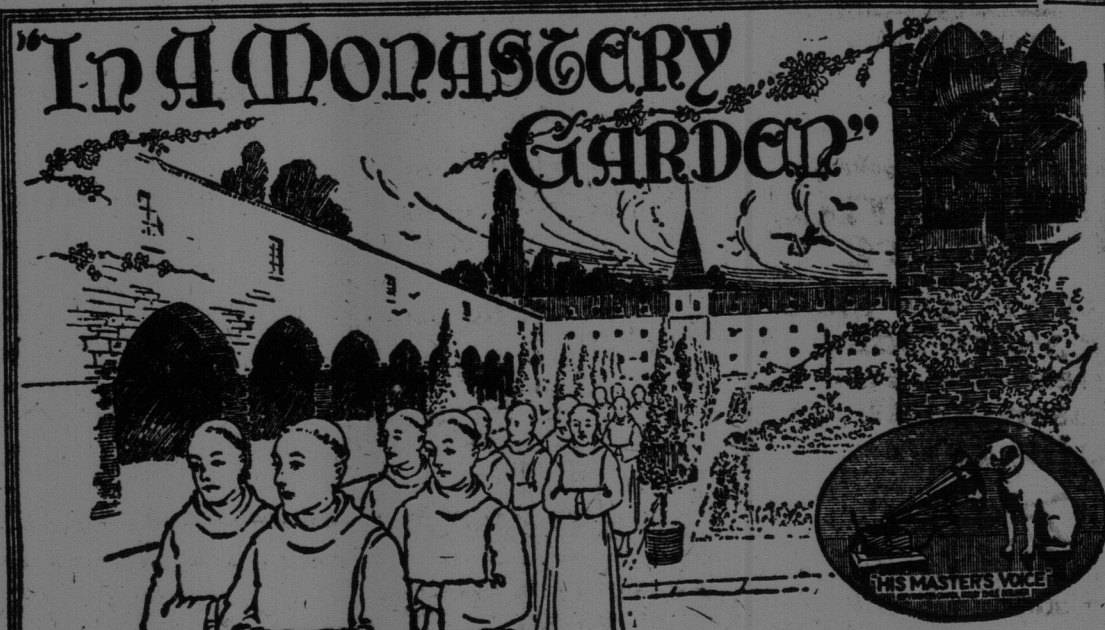
general gave instructions for this to be done. Various rumors were traced to

KIEV THREATENED

It is reported that there was a reign of terror in the city of Kiev during January, and nearly 1,000 persons were killed.

DISTURBANCE AT TORONTO MEETING

Four Interrupters Ejected as Major Putnam and Rustomjee Try to Speak.

Toronto, Feb. 18.—Four persistent interrupters at a meeting in Massey Hall last night under the auspices of the British Empire League of Canada were removed from the building by the police and taken before Chief of Police Dickson. He lectured them and promised them jail for the next offence of the kind.

The meeting was addressed by Major George H. Putnam of New York and Rustomjee of Bombay, India.

Hoots, hisses, cat calls and boisterous conversation interrupted both speakers, and not even the appeal of Major Putnam that "an old man of seventy-seven years," be allowed to finish what he had to say was heeded. The conclusion of Mr. Rustomjee's address was lost in a babel of noise.

The interruptions came from a noisy minority in an audience of about 1,500 people and did not represent the feelings of the great majority of those present.

Mr. Rustomjee, referred to recent statements made in this city that the economic condition of India was worse than before the British government took control of the country; that the people were denied education, and that Great Britain did not intend to prepare the people for self government. He declared that these three charges were untrue and he dealt with them as fully as the disturbers would allow him.
