"A passenger car is an absolute necessity for the county secretary," said A. E. Roberts, general secretary of the Y. M. C. A. county work, when interviewed. "We specify a car as a part of the ideal equipment. He needs it to cover the territory. Not all of our secretaries have cars, but all are working toward that end; and in time each county centre will be working to full efficiency with a car. Yes, there are 3,000 counties in the United States, so there is unlimited room for expansion in this field."

There are ninety county superintendents of public welfare in North Carolina, the great majority of whom own pasthe great majority of whom own passenger cars. These men serve as organizers of county improvements along various lines, with special reference to child welfare.

welfare.

The Y. W. C. A. has 1,183 branches in the United States, of which 336 are in cities, sixty-four in towns, thirty-two in counties, and the remainder are student branches. The Y. W. uses cars where it is necessary for the "workers to travel around and cover large distances. The only way to do this ef ing cars," to quote the headquarters of fice of the Y. W. C. A. in New York.
