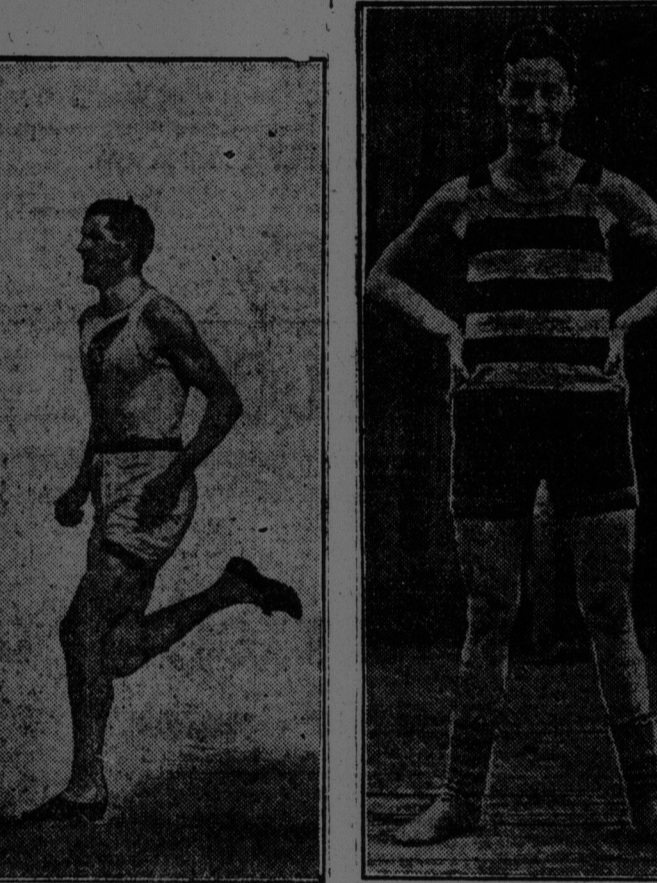
Longboat Won a Great Race. Toronto, June 9.—Two world records and two Canadian records were broken in the fifteen mile invitation race run at the Island stadium last night.
