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There is a bright future before this College. It has great blessings in store for the young women of this country. And the purpose of the directors is to continue to supply it with all the equipment necessary to meet the highest ideal of education for young ladies. No branch of instruction will be overlooked. The steady aim of the Institution will ever be to send forth from its classes cultured and Christian women.

The various subjects of study, such as English, modern languages, mathematics, classics, music, painting, elocution, etc., receive careful attention. The course of study begins in primary work, and extends all the way up to the end of the second year in the provincial University.

The teachers all have a high standing of efficiency in their several departments, and the examinations of the pupils have been most creditable to the quality of their instruction. This year, as last year, four of the pupils have taken the first and second year's examinations in the provincial University, while every medallist of the College during the last four years has had a two years' standing in the highest school of learning among us

An instructive course of lectures has been continued once a week through the year, when the leading professors of Toronto-and of Victoria universities have given papers on subjects of great interest.

For the last session, the attendance has been larger than ever before, while the increased room for accommodating pupils, together with so many home comforts in the shape of heating, lighting, plumbing, etc., encourages the hope that next year will surpass all previous records in point of attendance.

We call upon the friends of the higher education of young women to forward the cause of religion and of culture by giving the Ontario Ladies' College their earnest support, and to communicate freely with the Principal, Rev. J. J. Hare, Ph.D., whose untiring industry and enthusiastic devotion has given to this College the present proud position among the colleges of the Dominion.
