All the other clubs are out of the running for the Hair trophy and the Sinclain hield. There is left to finish up the single competition today the rinks skipped by W. J. Brown and W. A. Shaw of the Thistles; J. H. Hawthorne and S. D. Simmons of Fredericton; J. Edwards, of Moncton, and E. S. Rox borough of Carleton.

So far the bonspiel has been a great success and the curlers have had a great time of it. The curlers who played two and three games yesterday were pretty tired last night and all were happy when the last stone was curled.

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
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
