At 8 o'clock on the morning following, Mr. Hearn, keeper of the lighthouse at Tern Point, telegraphed to the lispector of polies that the wreck and several corpses had been driven ashore, and that a number of wreckers had gathered on the beach with evident intention to plunder. The inspector started at once with five constables for the shore, He concluded that the sobooner had drifted on a lee shore and struck the breakers near the Point when the storm raged too ficroely for any man or boat to reach the shore.
