BAKER, EDGAR CROW, *Navig. Lieut. R.N.; J.P. (Victoria, B.C.)*

Descended from an old English family, which traces its descent from 1310. Third surviving s. of Edward William Whitley Baker, of Liscard Park, Cheshire Eng., formerly an officer in the Royal Navy. Born 16 Sept., 1845, at Lambeth, Surrey, Eng. Educated at the Royal Hospital Upper School, Greenwich, at which he obtained nomination into the Royal Navy, by competition, as a Master's Assistant. M., 17 March, 1869, at the Parish Church, Bebington, Cheshire, Frances Mary, eldest dau. of Captain Richard Jones, of Halifax, N.S. Entered the Royal Navy 11 Sept., 1860 obtained first Commission Navig. Sub. Lieut., 11 Sept., 1865, and Lieutenant's Commission 9 Aug., 1870. Was Navigating Lieutenant of H.M.S. "Cockatrice," "Royal Alfred," and "Niobe." Retired, with the relative mark of Major in the Army, 22 Sept., 1878. Is an Accountant, Notary, and J. P. for B. C. Was Accountant in the Prov. Treasury, B.C. Is Presdt. of the Rock Creek Mining Co., and of the B. C. Rifle Asso.; a dir. of the Matsqui Land Co., and of the Royal Hospital in 1883; Secretary to the Board of Pilot Comms. and Superintendent of Pilots; Secretary of the B. C. Board of Trade and Vice-Presdt. of the same; Secretary of the Victoria and Esquimaux Telephone Co.; Past Grand Master of Masons, and Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Freemasons. Was a mem. of the City Council of Victoria in 1882. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at last g.e. BARNARD, FRANK STILLMAN. (*Cariboo.*) 2nd Mem.

Eldest s. of F. J. Barnard, ex-M.P. for Yale. The Barnards are old settlers of Massachusetts, the progenitor of the present family sitting there prior to 1642. The Canadian branch of the family moved to Lower Can. about 1800. B. in Toronto, 16 May, 1856. Moved to B. C. 1860. Ed. at Hellmuth Coll., London, Ont.
