



In addition to a first rate faculty, students can utilize a wide range of Research Institutes located on campus. These include: the 100-Mev electron accelerator laboratory; NRC - Plant Biotechnology Institute; Agriculture Canada Research Station; Veterinary Infectious Disease Organization; National Hydrology Research Institute, Saskatchewan Research Council and others located in Innovation Place, an industrial research park adjacent to the University.

University scholarships are available. For 1990-91 Master's and Ph.D. level awards will be in excess of \$12,000 and \$15,000 respectively. Supplements may be available for exceptional students.
