shall, during the continuance of the work, be paid fair wages. Inasmuch, however, as it is considered that said project is of a class and character which the Governor in Council, pursuant to the powers granted under Section 5 of the Fair Wages and Hours of Labour Act, 1935, can class as a "special case" it is agreed that in general the maximum number of hours per day and per week to be worked by any employee on the said project shall not exceed eight (8) per day and forty-four (44) per week respectively, but in such instances as the Province deems advisable, the said maximum may be exceeded, with the limitation that in no instance shall any employee work in excess of an average of forty-eight hours per week over a period of three consecutive calendar weeks. The Province shall keep complete records of the hours worked per day and per week by each of its employees on the project authorized by this Agreement and such records shall be available for inspection and audit by the Dominion.

The Province may supply the whole or any part of the materials necessary to execute and complete all or any parts of the project authorized by this Agreement, but it is understood that the Province will not make any charge as against the Dominion for any timber, lumber or other materials supplied in construction on said project from the Crown lands of the Province except for labour or transportation costs necessarily incurred in respect of such of the said matorials as are actually used on the project during the torm of this Agreement and except the reasonable cost of materials used from property bought by the Province for the purpose of procuring materials for use on the said project. All materials shall be of Canadian manufacture if obtainable of suitable quality and price. The Province agrees that it will maintain adequate rocords of all expenditures incurred pursuant to this Agreement, supported by proper documents and vouchers and that such records. documents and vouchers will be segregated from although reconciled with, the usual records of the Province. The Province further
