



Ottawa, 22nd. August, 1908.

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 17th. instant, inclosing a letter from Messrs. Williams and Morrison, Barristers, Thessalon, pointing out that George Peever and his brother William Peever, owners of seventy acres and thirty-three acres, respectively, in the north-west quarter, section 21, western portion Thessalon, have united in disposing of these properties to one James Chillman, and that there are sufficient improvements upon the properties to comply with the regulations as to the issue of patents, I have to inform you that if Mr. Chillman will file with the Department through you an assignment from George Peever for his thirty-three acres, together with the usual registration fee of one dollar also statutory proof that he is now owner of the centre seventy acres, patented to William John Peever and that the lands have been occupied for three years, the Department will consider the question of issuing patents to Mr. Chillman as desired.
