Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 4th instant, No. 82/27, relating to the proposed exchange of a portion of the Norway House Reserve for another tract of land in that vicinity, I beg to enclose herewith a copy of a letter, dated the 19th instant, from the Secretary of the Department of the Interior.

It would appear to be advisable that the Agent should temporarily mark on the ground the land desired by the Indians, in order that no intending settler may in error settle thereon. Of course, as indicated by the Secretary, all the rights of those persons now settled on the lands are to be carefully respected.
