Ottawa 19th July, 1899.

Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 13th Instant, reporting that you have ascertained that Mrs Frank Trench's Name was left off the Cape Croker pay-list in June 1898, and stating that you were asked by the Council of that Band to place her name on the pay-list of the Chippewas of Saugeen, she having married a member of the latter Band; and in reply I have to inform you that you should have furnished this information on the pay-list for March quarter in the column headed "Remarks" which is intended to be used when it is necessary to put on record any special information regarding ^{any of} the payees.

As it appears from your letter that Mrs Trench (Wife of No 134 of the Saugeen Band) did not draw interest under No 60 of the Cape Croker ^{Band} since the distribution for March quarter 1898 the deduction of ^{\$}4.17 referred to in my letter of the 11th instant should not be made.
