The Minister of Agriculture, Hon. Valentine Winkler, has issued the warning to the farmers of Manitoba that good seed oats will be very scarce this Spring. He says that a good portion of the oats raised in large areas of the province last year were not suitable for seed. Farmers anywhere in Western Canada who have good, sound, plump, well-ripened oats, true to variety, and that are free or can be made free from noxious weeds ought to plan on selling these to other farmers for seed. Seed oats will command a good advance over the regular market price.
