OBITUARY

HON. ALLAN RITCHIE
The death of Hon. Allan Ritchie, one of Montreal's best known residents took place at Newcastle, Monday, Jan. 3, aged 83 years. All his life he has been engaged in the lumbering and shipping business. He was Newcastle's first Mayor, and was appointed in 1890 to the legislative council of this province and voted for the constitution of that body which took place two years later. The deceased had been president of the South-Western Miramichi Lumber Company for 30 years. He was a prominent Anglican, Freemason, and a member of the Highland Society of Miramichi.

There are three sons surviving, Allan H., Harold H., and David.

The surviving brothers and sisters are William, of Eau Claire, Wis., Arthur of Rice Lake, Wis., Miss Margaret, of Newcastle, and Mrs. Doherty, of Winnipeg.

IRA ALLEN SANKEY
Ira Allen Sankey, son of the late Ira D. Sankey, the hymn writer, died Dec. 30 on the steamship *Kovona*, while on his way to the West Indies on his wedding trip. Mr. Sankey was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, August 30, 1874, and was graduated from Princeton in 1897. He made a special study of architecture and civil engineering, but since 1898 he had been concerned with the music publishing business at Glasgow & Main Co.

He was married on December 20 to Mrs. Ann Underhill Meighan, a daughter of John Quincy Underhill, of New Rochelle, N. Y. Mr. Sankey had been ill and they had consequently planned to go to Barbados, a trip which would have taken about a month.

JOHN G. MURCHIE
St. Stephen, N. B., Jan. 5.—John G. Murchie, senior member of the firm of James Murchie Sons Co., lumber merchant of Calais, Me., passed suddenly away at his home in that city at an early hour this morning of apoplexy. Mr. Murchie was seventy-eight years of age and leaves a wife and three sons, Frank S. of Benton, N. B.; W. Thomas, of Fredericton and Albert, at home; and three daughters, Mrs. Harold Furves, of this town, Mrs. Benton and Mrs. John M. Johnson, of Boston. Four brothers survive here, William A., Skiffington; Henry S., of Calais; Frank C., of Milltown, N. B., and three sisters, Mrs. Adam Gillespie, Mrs. Edson of Calais, and Mrs. Charles Eaton, of Princeton, Me. Mr. Murchie was a deep water captain, and for several years was master of the barque *Mary Brown* and other square rigged vessels. He had been an honorary member of Sussex Lodge No. 7, F. & A. M. of this town for many years. The funeral will take place from his late residence in Calais on Friday afternoon at 3 o'clock. Interment will be in the Murchie family lot in St. Stephen cemetery.—Telegraph.

Mrs. MARY E. HANSON
The death took place at San Jose, Cal., on December 24, 1915, of Mary, beloved wife of Jeremiah M. Hanson, in the 74th year of her age.

Deceased, whose maiden name was Scott, was a native of St. George, Charlotte Co., and the family are well remembered residents of St. Andrews, where they lived before moving to California, about twenty years ago.

Local and General

Parliament opens at Ottawa on Wednesday next, January 12.

Rumors are in circulation that an addition is to be made to the dining room of the Algonquin Hotel, the work to be started very soon by the C. F. R. construction department.
