VACCINE PREVENTS TYPHOID.

Disease Practically Wiped Out From U. S. Army.

The U.S. army got through the year 1913 with only two cases of typhoid fever among a total of more than 50,-000 officers and men. One was that of a man who had not been treated with the typhoid vaccine and was believed to have contracted the fever before he enlisted; the other case was among the troops in China.

Before the vaccine was adopted typhoid cases in the army averaged about three to every 1,000 men, or in the neighborhood of 250 cases a year.
