

Care of Harness.

The life of a set of harness may be very considerably prolonged by the exercise of a little care in its treatment. When from accident or neglect harness has been soiled, it can easily be cleaned by washing with castile soap. As a dressing for keeping leather or harness phable, there are many preparations upon the market. Cod liver oil of the cheaper grades is now largely employed for this purpose instead of the neat's-foot oil which our forefathers used in such quantity for the preservation of their herness. One of the great advantage harness. One of the great advan-tages of using cod liver oil is that rats and mice usually give a wide berth to any harness or other ap-pliances dressed with this oil.—Ex.
