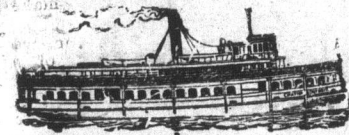

FIRE FROM MIDST OF SEA.

Sicily's Horror—Submarine Flare Formed Near Eolie and Surface Was Covered With Clouds of Steam.

Rome, Sept. 18.—Another earthquake occurred Saturday in the Province of Messina, Sicily, and in the Islands of Stromboli, Lipari and Eolie. The eruption of Stromboli is still very violent, and lava is flowing into the sea on the side of the island opposite Sicily, causing a terrific noise.

Between the Island of Eolie and Milazzo, Sicily, the sea suddenly rose up and flames and smoke issued from the midst of the waters, which were covered with dense steam for a distance of two kilometers. Geologists say that this is due to the opening of a submarine fissure, and that it shows the seismic disturbances are not yet finished.

M. Capitelli, prefect of Messina, has left for Lipari and Stromboli, and the population is completely terrorized and is sleeping in small boats, fearing to pass the night ashore.

Vesuvius, too, is very active, and there is a strong flow of lava, accompanied by subterranean rumblings. There were also fresh shocks of earthquake at Catanzaro, Monteleone and Cosenza. The Cathedral of Monteleone threatens to fall and will have to be demolished. At Scigliano during the earthquake the earth opened and the river Saruto was swallowed up, but afterward reappeared. At Pizzo the water of the streams turned hot.

CAZAR AIDS OIL MEN.

Calls Conference and Orders Troops to Aid Area.

St. Petersburg, Sept. 18.—The Emperor has ordered the convening at the end of September of a conference of oil men, industrial representatives of Central Russia, representatives of the Volga Steamship Co., and those persons in Government Departments interested to examine into the situation and to report to the Minister of Finance.

The Emperor also ordered the immediate concentration in the vicinity of the oil fields of a sufficient number of troops to guarantee order and the formation of a police force, recruited from reservists, for the protection of the works.

Acting on an Imperial mandate, the Solsky commission will commence next week the elaboration of plans for a Ministerial Cabinet, the work to be completed before the meeting of the National Assembly.

Will Allow This Congress. Moscow, Sept. 18.—M. Golvin, president of the Moscow Soviet, Saturday visited Governor Grey, with reference to the forthcoming Zemstvo congress. The Governor-General said that the congress would be permitted, but that its program must be confined to three points: first, participation of Zemstvos in town elections for the Douma; second, organization of the electoral campaign, and third, participation of Zemstvos in towns in the work of assisting the famine-stricken districts.

Paying the Penalty. Sebastopol, Sept. 18.—Two of the mutineers of the Georgi Pobiedonostay were executed here Saturday. The sentence of death on a third man was reduced to penal servitude for life.

Shetlands For the Children. The cry of the children is for a perfect pet. What the rattle and the doll are of the earliest years of us, that the Shetland pony is said to become for older childhood. This animal is the one only pet that won't at some time or other make reprisal on the hand that nags. The dog—every dog—will bite when the child becomes too familiar. There are elements in a cat's nature that puzzle and repulse the child, a something that makes it walk "by its wild lone." The goat is inadequate. We could analyze a Noah's Ark of animals in this way only to find that the one satisfying safe living pet is the Shetland pony. If more than eight children ride his back he will shake himself like a wet Newfoundland and then stand motionless, while they pick themselves up and out from his four hoofs. A large and more highly nerved grade of horse would trample the children and their tripping him—Country Life in America.

A Lesson In Punctuation. A school inspector visited a certain Scotch town in order to make a round of the schools, and very courteously called first on the Mayor, to invite his Worship to accompany him, according to the Dundee Advertiser. On the messenger announcing his presence to the Mayor, the inspector, who was waiting in an outer room, overheard the remark, "I should like to know why he said nothing, but bided his time. At one of the schools, as he was asking a class a few questions in grammar, His Worship remarked, 'We don't bother about commas and such like.' Whereupon the inspector bade one of the boys write on the blackboard the words, 'The Mayor of Chessington says the inspector is an ass.' 'Now,' he continued, 'put a comma after 'Chessington' and another after 'inspector' and see if they make any difference.' The Mayor thought they did."

She Said Grace. A visitor of noble birth was expected to arrive at a large country house in the North of England, and the daughter of the house, aged seven, was receiving final instructions from her mother.

"And now, dear," she said, "when the Duke speaks to you, do not forget always to say 'your Grace.'"
