SAYS REPORT UNTRUE

Editor Journal:

Dear Sir:

Allow me to correct the statements
in last night's Journal regarding Hugh
Swindley, Bolshevik, and the I. W. W.
I did say that I had been a mem-
ber of the I. W. W. and that it was
on my account of my desire to study
that organization at first hand that I
went to the U. S. U. some six years
ago. I said also that my investigation
had convinced me that it was an im-
practicable proposition for bringing
about that change in society which is
the ultimate goal of the working class
movement. I also gave it as my opinion
that the Bolshevik literature being
distributed was the work of crazy
fanatics, and tried to explain from
my personal observations how men
developed into that stage of import-
ant protest against unjust conditions. I
have had no connection whatever with
the I. W. W. since the latter part
of 1914, and my opinions of present
day unrest have been gathered from
papers, magazines and periodicals,
which are accessible to all. It is true,
I said, "that we had to take with a
grain of salt some of the reports as to
conditions in Russia." My reason for
making that statement was based upon
the reports of journalists or war cor-
respondents who had given evidence
before the Overman Senatorial Inves-
tigating Committee at Washington. At
the same time, I repeated again that
atrocities had no doubt been com-
mitted and were to be condemned.
My object was to point out to my fel-
low citizens, what actions in our daily
lives, are likely to manufacture Bol-
sheviks. I expressed a desire some
time ago to a few well known citizens
in St. Catharines to speak upon this
subject to the Canadian Club or the
Board of Trade, and I told them I
had personal knowledge of the I. W. W.
etc., and if a sincere effort at a
better understanding between Capital
and Labor was to be brought about, it
was necessary to understand some of
the causes that were at present oper-
ating to promote the growth of Bol-
shevism. I was guided in this action
by a sincere desire as a citizen to help
in the work of reconstruction. I have

that I have been a member of the I.
W. W. but it is untrue for the Journal
to say that I declared that I was
an I. W. W. and a Bolshevik at the
I. L. P. meeting last Sunday night. If
a man's usefulness as a citizen and a
patriot is to be judged by his utter-
ances in public and private, and by his
daily actions in relation to his fellow
citizens and fellow soldiers, then I am
prepared to stand comparison with any
man who would try to discredit me in
the eyes of my fellow citizens. In con-
clusion let me say that it is a false-
hood for anyone to say that I asked
permission to speak at the I. L. P.
meeting on Sunday night. I was asked
to speak by Mr. Beaver on account of
Mr. Marks not turning up. I told
him I did not want to speak, and he
replied that Mr. Swazie had to go
away early and they were short of
speakers. I then consented, and I hope
that what I did say will have the
effect of causing more attention to be
given to the causes of Bolshevism
than has hitherto been the case, and
let us not forget in all our actions
that prevention is better than cure.
