dishonesty, extravagance and graft and lack of conscience in the department. It might be possible to make a good light service without paying a couple of contractors some \$2,000,000, and allowing them 1,000 per cent profit.

MR. FISHER AND MR. FOSTER.

The Minister of Agriculture is evidently distressed over the success of Mr. Foster's meetings as compared with his own. Consequently Mr. Fisher took occasion at Lechate to accuse Mr. Foster of misusing the funds of the Foresters. The minister went so far as to suggest that if Mr. Foster had not done as he did the Foresters would not have needed to increase their assessments.

WORSE AND WORSE.

August returns show that the revenue continues to fall off. The shortage in customs revenue as compared with the previous year is over a million. Altogether the loss of revenue and increased expenditure make the situation two millions worse than in August, 1907, and for the five months of this fiscal year, ten millions worse than last year.

The Quebec Bridge.

By act of parliament passed last session the government was given authority to construct the Quebec bridge as a public work. The first step toward carrying out the will of parliament in that regard was taken a few weeks ago, when the government appointed three engineers of undoubted eminence in the engineering profession as a board of experts to prepare plans and carry out the work of erecting the bridge as a national undertaking.

To Refresh the Public Memory.

Now that the Federal elections are approaching it will not be out of place to refresh the public mind regarding some of the acts of the present government, and the careless manner in which it has committed the country to huge expenditures without the most ordinary precaution or proper previous investigation may be illustrated by the case of the Junction end of the Transcontinental. At the inception of the enterprise the statement was made by Sir Wilfrid Laurier that, whereas the Intercolonial was a round-about route because it followed two sides of a triangle it would be necessary to parallel this state-owned railway by a line from Moncton to Quebec.

The Yukon Report.

The report for the past fiscal year of the Commissioner of the Yukon territory tells again of the disappearance of the independent miner working on his own account and of the growth of the company with extensive machinery and large capital as the chief gold producer. The output of gold in the twelve months is given as 189,811 ounces, which, at \$15 an ounce, the value fixed for royalty purposes, represented \$2,847,165. As the work of getting gold is the basic industry of the territory, all others being subsidiary or tributary to it, the moderate figure noted will help to understand why the country is declining in population, and why the revenue, which was \$332,846, falls short of the expenditure, which amounted to \$338,755.
