

The revolutionary leaders, having overthrown the Monarchy, are nowconfronted with the scarcely less serious task of putting an end to excesses on the part of the rougher element, their own followers, who, having had a taste of mob rule, are prone Patriarch of to continue in a career of lawlessness. The decree of summary banishment for the religionists has given en excuse for brutal outrages against the clergy. The Provisional Government has recognized the seriousness of the situation, and to-day the police used severe measures to prevent the opulation from sacking religious esablishments and in stopping demonstrations against religionists, pending their expulsion. Reports that the clericals were carrying on guerilla warfare from the windows of their stablishments inflamed public rentment against the religious orders, iany members of which were chased from their churches and convents. A mob which battered down the doors of a convent in Rue do Quelhas was led by fanatics and a gang of ruffians, who seized the occasion to destroy everything in sight. Images and staies were wrenched from the altars, urniture broken and vestments carricd off. As was the case at the time of the Barcelona riots, popular feelngs seems to be restricted to the onks and nuns, and does not manifest itself towards the secular clergy.
